

Introduction

SECTION

This section introduces the concept of Journeys, a feature in the Navigate360 Student App designed to provide students with step-by-step guidance to meet their goals.

What are Journeys?

College doesn't come with an instruction manual for students.

For the major decisions students face while enrolled, we've created Journeys to provide students with step-by-step guidance to meet their goals.

The Journeys feature in Navigate360 helps students understand and complete essential steps towards their goals. Designed to extend beyond mere course planning, these Journeys empower students to focus on proactive, forward-thinking milestones crucial to their college experience. Sample Journeys we'll provide in this Starter Pack include New Student Onboarding, First-Year Student Orientation, Affording College, Getting a Job, Graduate School Planning, Preparing for Graduation, and Mental Health & Wellness.

Journeys are configured by each institution and are comprised of steps. Steps are fully customizable to match the processes at your institution, and can contain details like text descriptions, links, images, videos, and resources. As students navigate Journeys, they can mark these steps as completed. Each Journey must be associated with a Topic. If you don't see a recommended Topic available, Content Administrators can create new Topics from the Content Administration Tool > Topics.

Students can add Journeys to their profiles or can be assigned Journeys from staff in Navigate360. Once a Journey is assigned or added, students can access the steps in the Navigate360 Student app or desktop site.

Only include specific dates if necessary to reduce the number of updates you'll need to make year over year.

2

Customize content with multimedia.

Add videos, links, and contact information to the steps of your Journeys. This is a great opportunity to enrich your content with valuable resources for students.

Get help!

Any content administrator with permissions to edit and publish Journeys can assist in creating Journeys and steps. Consider assembling a Journey Content Team to support initial Journey configuration.


